


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


White Christians Have Become Even Less Motivated to Address Racial Injustice

One might assume that the events of 2020 have increased awareness of racial injustice in the United States and motivation to address it. But the story isn't so straightforward, new Barna research (conducted in partnership with Dynata) suggests. Yes, there are signs the past year has clarified how Americans think about racial injustice—but that doesn't mean they see the issue, or their role within it, with greater urgency. In the Church especially, there is a sense that people are doubling down on divides.




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


From Dr. King's conclusion:

Martin Luther's <u>doctrine of the two kingdoms</u>

- Martin Luther's <u>doctrine of the two kingdoms</u> (or two reigns) of God teaches that God is the ruler of the whole world and that he rules in two ways, both by the law and by the gospel.
- God rules the earthly kingdom through secular government, by means of <u>law</u> and the sword. As Creator, God would like to promote social justice, and this is done through the political use of the law.
- At the same time, God rules his spiritual kingdom in order to promote human righteousness before God. This is done through the *gospel*, according to which all humans are justified by God's grace alone.



•22 Paul then stood up in the meeting of the Areopagus and said: "People of Athens! I see that in every way you are very religious. 23 For as I walked around and looked carefully at your objects of worship, I even found an altar with this inscription: TO AN UNKNOWN GOD. So you are ignorant of the very thing you worship—and this is what I am going to proclaim to you.

•24 "The God who made the world and everything in it is the Lord of heaven and earth and does not live in temples built by human hands. ²⁵ And he is not served by human hands, as if he needed anything. Rather, he himself gives everyone life and breath and everything else. ²⁶ From one man he made all the nations, that they should inhabit the whole earth; and he marked out their appointed times in history and the boundaries of their lands. ²⁷ God did this so that they would seek him and perhaps reach out for him and find him, though he is not far from any one of us. ²⁸ 'For in him we live and move and have our being.' As some of your own poets have said, 'We are his offspring.'



He has given proof of this to everyone by raising him from the dead."
