Born June 1936 in Akron, Ohio, Paul's father died in early 1941 of trichinosis. His grandmother and youngest uncle (Werner) moved in with Paul and his mother. In 1944 Werner went to Concordia in River Forest, Illinois for high school and graduated from college there in 1952.

Paul's mother remarried in June 1949, and they moved to Mayfield Hts., Ohio (suburb east of Cleveland) where he gained three stepbrothers (one older). He attended Our Savior in Mayfield Hts. and was confirmed there in 1950. Educated through grade 7 at Zion in Akron, he graduated from St. John, South Euclid in 1950. In 1954 he graduated from Cleveland Lutheran High (downtown) and from River Forest as a teacher with organ and choir skills in 1958. He received a M.Ed. in 1968 from Wayne State University in Detroit.

Assigned in 1958 to Martin Luther Chapel and Christian Day School in Pennsauken NJ, Paul married 1st and 2nd grade teacher Dorothy Chorba in 1960 and accepted the Call to Peace in Detroit as teacher and director of church music. His son Werner and daughter Kristen were born and baptized at Peace Lutheran Church.

In 1969 Paul determined to move from teaching to pastoring and church music and accepted the invitation of Pastor John E. Meyer to serve Concordia in Maplewood, MO as interim church musician while enrolled in a colloquy program at Concordia Seminary in St. Louis. He was assigned to Concordia as vicar in 1971 upon completion of the colloquy program, and assistant pastor in 1972 upon ordination at Our Savior in Mayfield Heights, OH. He asked not to be called as pastor when Pastor Meyer accepted a Missouri District position.

In 1974 Paul received and accepted the Call to Pastor Zoar with Northwest Lutheran School in Elmwood Park, Illinois. In 1979 he accepted the Call to Immanuel in Des Plaines, Illinois as associate pastor and director of church and school music. In 1989 he was encouraged to train and become a hospital chaplain. With Lutheran General Hospital nearby he remained at Immanuel part-time while completing a four-quarter residency in Clinical Pastoral Education. In 1991 Paul was employed by Chicago College of Osteopathic Medicine for their hospital in Olympia Fields, Illinois. He retired in 2001 from full-time work.

Dorothy died in 2015 of dementia complications after a fall. With peripheral neuropathy and using a rollator Paul now lives in Brookdale Senior Solutions in Des Plaines near his daughter, son and several congregations for worship and service.


