Workbook Addendum 6-2 June 26, 2025

#### **RESOLUTION 1-01A**

To Encourage the English District of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod to Affirm Unequivocally the Practice of First Communion Prior to Confirmation as a God-pleasing Practice so as to Encourage Member Congregations and Pastors of the English District to Recognize the Validity of the Aforementioned Practice and, On That Basis, Commune Visiting Children Who, Though Not Yet Confirmed, Are Nevertheless Communicant Members in Good Standing and Who, Therefore, Should Not Be Denied the Lord's Body and Blood Because They Have Not Yet Been Confirmed.

WHEREAS, Many member congregations of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod receive children as communicants to the Lord's Supper through the Rite of First Communion Prior to Confirmation (LSB: Agenda 25-27), and, therefore, have non-Confirmed, yet communicant children who regularly and faithfully commune at their home congregations; and

WHEREAS, The majority of our Member Congregations do not receive children as full communicant members until they have completed Confirmation and have gone through the Rite of Confirmation (LSB: Agenda, 28-31); and

WHEREAS, Both the Rite of First Communion Prior to Confirmation as well as the Rite of Confirmation are countenanced and legitimated by Synod as evidenced by the presence of each rite in and use out of the *Lutheran Service Book: Agenda*; and

WHEREAS, Both rites exist, not by divine command, but as human ordinances and thus neither have the status of a Sacrament (Ap. XIII.6); and

WHEREAS, Neither rite confers the status of worthy communicant, which is determined, not by a human ordinance, "but that person is truly worthy and well prepared who has faith in these words: AGiven and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins," (SC VI; cf., 1Cor.11:27-29); and

WHEREAS, Both rites fulfill the prescription of the Lutheran Confessions that "people are admitted only if they first had an opportunity to be examined and heard" (AC XXIV.6-7) and "the sacrament is made available to those who wish to partake of it, after they have been examined and absolved" (Ap XXIV.1); (see General Notes for both rites, p. 25 and 28 respectively; and

WHEREAS, The Lutheran Confessions do not require uniform rites, ordinances, and ceremonies for the sake of the unity of faith and the Church (AC VII.3; cf., Ap XV.18), thus allowing disparate rites to admit children to the Lord's Supper; and

WHEREAS, The Rite of First Communion Prior to Confirmation continues as the minority practice in the Synod, there have been anecdotal cases of children being refused Communion at sister congregations, not on the basis of their unworthiness, determined by whether or not they believe the promise of Jesus "given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins," but on the basis, either of their non-Confirmed status or, otherwise, an arbitrary age restriction; and

WHEREAS, Refusal to Commune such visiting children who have been legitimately received to the Lord's Table through instruction, examination, and absolution, which precedes the Rite of First Communion Prior to Confirmation, causes such little ones, whose angels always behold the face of their Father in heaven, to stumble through confusion and offense (Matt. 18:6: ; see Ap XV.49 regarding how "traditions").

are truly traps of consciences"); therefore be it

Resolved, That the English District in convention unequivocally affirm the practice of First Communion Prior to Confirmation as a God-pleasing practice and a legitimate way to faithful reception of the Lord's Supper; and be it further

 Resolved, That the English District in convention encourage Member Congregations and Pastors of the English District to recognize the validity of the aforementioned practice of First Communion Prior to Confirmation so as to commune visiting children who, though not yet confirmed, are nevertheless communicant members in good standing at their home congregations; and be it further

*Resolved,* That the English District in convention reject and condemn the error of refusing the body and blood of Jesus Christ to visiting communicant children on the basis of their non-Confirmed status or an arbitrary age restriction; and be it further

*Resolved,* That the English District in convention encourage the Synod in Convention to adopt the same position; and be it further

*Resolved,* That the English District survey her Member Congregations in order to determine the percentage of congregations making use of the rite of First Communion Prior to Confirmation, and publish the results of said survey among our congregations; and be it further

Resolved, That the English District in convention encourage the Synod in Convention to survey all Member Congregations in order to determine the percentage of congregations making use of the rite of First Communion prior to confirmation, and publish the results of said survey among the congregations of Synod; and be it finally

Resolved, That the English District prepare a tool kit for congregations and Pastors that both equips Pastors who desire to implement such a rite to teach about the practice of First Communion Prior to Confirmation and that, likewise, equips Pastors to instruct congregations who do not yet understand the God-pleasing nature of the rite of First Communion Prior to Confirmation so that such congregations who do not observe this practice gladly welcome and receive visiting communicant children who desire to receive the Lord's Supper, and that encourages all communicant members to announce for Communion when visiting congregations other than their own.

## To State Religious Objection to Government Interference of Parents' Duty

WHEREAS, The Small Catechism confesses that God has created and given to each person "my body"; and

WHEREAS, The body of the baptized is the temple of the Holy Spirit and belongs not to government or its institutions (such as schools: public or private), but to God (1 Corinthians 6:19); and

WHEREAS, The Fourth Commandment, as explained in the Large Catechism, places all authority over a child on the parents of that child, so that we confess, "All authority flows and is born from the authority of parents. Where a father is unable alone to educate his child, he uses a schoolmaster to teach the child. So all whom we call "masters" are in the place of parents and <u>must get their power and authority</u> to govern from them" (para 141-142; emphasis added); and

WHEREAS, The Scriptures (and the Catechism) do not limit parental authority to a particular age, but state that God has given authority to parents over all children who live in their household; and

WHEREAS, Government in our society at federal, state, and local levels has attempted or may attempt to step between children and their parents (impeding the parents' duty to raise their children in the faith and life of the Christian confession) in various ways, including but not limited to

Laws that mandate vaccines for children even without parents' approval

  Laws that allow, recommend, or give children sex-change operations or medical procedures for "transitioning" minors without parents' approval

 • Laws that permit minors to get an abortion without parents' approval

 Laws that label parents who refuse their minor children vaccines, sex-change operations and procedures, or abortions as engaging in child abuse
 Laws that remove children from the custody of parents who refuse their minor children

vaccines, sex-change operations and procedures, or abortions
 School policies that teach children various anti-scriptural social agendas without parents' approval

School policies that mandate vaccines for children even without parents' approval

  School policies that encourage children to "transition" or use gender-confusing language or introduce sexual or gender identities that do not conform with the child's birth sex without parents' approval

Therefore, be it

Resolved, That the English District boldly, unequivocally, and plainly state its objection on the grounds of religious belief to any federal, state, or local law or mandate, or any school policy, that imposes the government's will over the parents' duty to raise their children or that aids the minor child's will to be kept secret from the parents; and further be it

Resolved, That the English District state plainly its willingness and readiness to support, come to the aid of, and speak in defense of any parents within sister congregations of the English District who face the challenge of government laws or school policies interfering with parents' duties to raise their children in the fear of the Lord; and be it further

Resolved, That the English District urge The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod in convention and each and every one of her districts to boldly, unequivocally, and plainly state their unconditional agreement with this religious objection to government interference in the Christian parent's duty to raise their children in the faith and life of the Christian confession; and be it further

Resolved, That the English District urge The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod and each and every one of her districts to boldly, unequivocally, and plainly denounce any teachings of any church bodies which seek to advocate for or tolerate the government interfering with parents' duties in raising their children in the Christian faith and life. Such teachings are unbiblical, unchristian, heretical, opposed to God, and worthy of condemnation; and be it finally

Resolved, That the English District urge her congregations and all their families to benefit their children with the use of Lutheran schools or Lutheran homeschools/hybrid co-ops, or to become involved in their local public school government, that the parents may safeguard their God-given responsibility, and that the children may be protected from such government overreach and godless agendas and may be raised in the proper fear of the Lord.

## **To Reject Kinism**

WHEREAS, We are all descended from Adam and Eve, who were created in God's image, and therefore are members of one human race, each formed by Him and with a special status in His created order (Genesis 1:26-28, 3:20, 9:6; Psalm 8:4-8, 139:13-16; Acts 17:25-26; Ephesians 3:15); and

WHEREAS, We are all equally sinners for whom Christ died and rose again, that all who believe in Him should not perish but have eternal life (Psalm 51:10; John 3:16-17; Romans 4:25; Ephesians 2:5); and

WHEREAS, By His will, God's Church on earth includes members from a great diversity of backgrounds (1 Corinthians 12:13; Galatians 3:28; Ephesians 2:11-14); and

WHEREAS, God shows no partiality among His people (Deuteronomy 10:17; Job 34:19; Acts 10:34; Romans 2:10-11; Galatians 2:6; Ephesians 6:9; Colossians 3:25; 1 Peter 1:17); and

WHEREAS, We are called to deeply love and serve one another as God has first loved us (Leviticus 19:18; Matthew 19:19, 22:39; Mark 12:31; Luke 10:27; Romans 13:9; Galatians 5:14, 6:10; 1 Corinthians 9:22; 2 Corinthians 6:3; James 2:8; 1 Peter 2:17; 1 John 4:10,19); and

WHEREAS, We joyfully anticipate the Last Day, when we will be numbered among a great multitude from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages eternally in God's presence, and singing His praise (Revelation 7:9-10; cf. Revelation 5:8-9); and

WHEREAS, Hatred of the brother is a grievous sin akin to murder, violating the sanctity of human life, and with grave impact on one's eternal salvation (Exodus 20:13 [Deuteronomy 5:17]; Matthew 5:21-22; Galatians 5:21; 1 John 3:14-15; Revelation 21:8; SC The Fifth Commandment); and

WHEREAS, The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) Committee on Theology and Church Relations released the report *Racism and the Church: Overcoming the Idolatry* in February, 1994 which condemned the hatred of our brothers, stating, "It is time to let our light shine and, through the proclamation of the glorious Gospel of our blessed God, to lead the way to the inclusion of all our sisters and brothers in Christ in the full exercise of the rights and privileges that belong to them as priests. What a beautiful opportunity we have to let God's will be done on earth as it most certainly is done in heaven, where there is not now, nor will there ever be, any partiality shown to anyone. We must all continually seek God's help in helping each other in our Synod to resist the temptations toward racist thinking and to eradicate its poisonous effects in our lives, that we may walk together in true unity of mind, heart, and purpose, even as we are one in Christ."; and

WHEREAS, The Synod in convention has over time adopted numerous resolutions condemning hatred based on race in all of its manifestations across the political and ideological spectrum, including 2019 Resolution 11-04A, To Affirm the Common Humanity of All People and Ethnicities; and 2023 Resolution 11-02A, To Reject All Forms of Racism and Affirm Our Witness to All People; and

WHEREAS, Kinism promotes the belief that God has ordained separation of races in all areas of life, twists Scripture to divide the Church by race, and promote racial superiority and segregation ("Has God indeed said...?", cf. Genesis 3:1); and

WHEREAS, Kinism has been roundly condemned by the Synodical leadership; and

WHEREAS, Individuals, some of whom are members of LCMS congregations, have promoted Kinism online, at times attacking Synod as a whole, and at times individual members of Synod, sadly attempting to lure the faithful away from the truth of Scripture (Matthew 24:11; Acts 20:30; 2 Corinthians 11:13; 1 Timothy 4:1; 2 Peter 2:1-3; Jude 4); therefore be it

Resolved, That the English District reject and publicly condemn Kinism, affirming that all baptized believers are one in Christ (Romans 12:4-5; 1 Corinthians 10:17, 12:12,20; Ephesians 2:19, 4:4-5,16; Colossians 3:15), and encourage Synod to do the same; and be it further

*Resolved*, That the English District encourage her Pastors to make their congregations aware of the challenge of Kinism, and refute it through the lens of Scripture and the Lutheran Confessions, and encourage Synod to do the same; and be it further

Resolved, That the English District encourage her Pastors in the course of their teaching, to intentionally teach sound hermeneutical principles to the members of their congregations, to equip the laity to respond to this or any temptation of "Has God indeed said...?" (Genesis 3:1) by appealing to Scripture rightly read and understood (Matthew 4:1-11; 1 John 4:1), and encourage the Synod to do the same; and be it further

Resolved, Resolved, that the English District in convention grant her support for the Bishop, insofar as he deems necessary, to publicly support any clergymen, congregation, or active member of the LCMS who/that is targeted, attacked, or threatened by individuals infected by Kinism, and encourage Synod to do the same; and be it finally

Resolved, That English District call on Pastors and laity to mark and avoid those who work to "cause divisions and create obstacles in the Church", and "deceive hearts" contrary to God's Truth (Romans 16:17-18), praying that they repent, receive His absolution and cleansing, restoration to His Church, and eternal life in Him (Luke 15:1-10; 1 John 1:9), and encourage Synod to do the same.

## **To Encourage Unity Among Our Churches**

### **Preamble**

With geopolitical and socio-economic strife is on the rise between Canada, the United States, and many other nations; and because these tensions are spilling into the hearts of the members of our congregations; and because the English District is part of God's holy Church and a "District without borders", we respectfully ask that the District issue a public statement encouraging repentance, amity, unity and prayer among our congregations.

WHEREAS, Geopolitical tension and socio-economic strife is creating division and antagonism between peoples and nations; and

WHEREAS, This political tension is being felt by members of our English District congregations; and

WHEREAS, The Kingdom of God is not of this world (*John 18:36*), Christ is undivided (*1 Corinthians 1:13*), and so too His Body (*Colossians 3:12-15*); and

Whereas, Luther's explanation of the eighth commandment in the *Small Catechism* states that we do not tell lies about our neighbors, betray or slander them, or destroy their reputations. Instead, we are to come to their defense, speak well of them, and interpret everything they do in the kindest way; Therefore, be it

*Resolved*, That the English District issue a public statement encouraging the Pastors and members of our congregations to repent of any sinful or divisive behaviors, receive the forgiveness and comfort Christ alone can give, pursue peace and unity with one another across international borders, and pray for and bless one another, beseeching the Father, Son and Holy Spirit's power and presence as they pray.

## **To Realign and Rename Visitation Circuits**

#### Preamble

Visitation Circuits are created by Districts and exist for the benefit of congregations and the rostered church workers of those congregations.

LCMS Bylaw 5.1.1 defines the purpose of Visitation Circuits:

5.1.1 A visitation circuit is a network of congregations that "walks together" for mutual care, support, advice, study, ecclesiastical encouragement, service, coordination, resources, and counsel—all for the sake of greater congregational participation in God's mission.

LCMS Bylaw 5.1.2 governs how Visitation Circuits are established, which is understood to mean that the establishment of Visitation Circuits is done by action of the District Convention, unless District Bylaws provide for another process:

5.1.2 Districts shall establish visitation circuits according to geographical criteria.

#### Rationale

Visitation Circuit 9 (Cleveland–Akron) and Visitation Circuit 10 (Cleveland–West) have seen a decline in member congregations and communicant members. For many years, these two Visitation Circuits have met together and continue to meet as essentially one Circuit. For the past several triennia, these two Visitation Circuits have been joined to create one Electoral Circuit for the purpose of electing delegates to the Synod Convention. These two Visitation Circuits desire to be combined into one Visitation Circuit.

The merger of Visitation Circuits 9 & 10 would eliminate a Visitation Circuit, requiring a renumbering of the Visitation Circuits of the District. The geographic location of several congregations would allow them to be better served by being moved to different Visitation Circuits. Additionally, several Visitation Circuits have begun to refer to themselves by new names to better reflect their member congregations.

Therefore be it

Resolved, That the current Visitation Circuits 9 & 10 be merged into one Visitation Circuit; and be it further

Resolved, That the Visitation Circuits of the English District be realigned and renamed as follows:

## To Amend English District Bylaws 5.4 and 9.1.1

WHEREAS, The elected voting membership of the English District Board of Directors currently consists of six (6) ministers of religion [four (4) ordained ministers—President, Secretary, one (1) ordained minister from the Eastern or Lake Erie Region, and one (1) ordained minister from the Midwestern or Western Region—and two (2) commissioned ministers] and six (6) laypersons [one (1) from each District Region and two (2) from the District at-large] who are elected by the District Convention (EN Bylaws 5.2.2, 5.4.4, 5.4.5, 5.5.3, and 9.1.1); and

 WHEREAS, Regional representation by ordained ministers to the District Board of Directors is currently provided by the four Regional Vice-Presidents, who "shall advise the President, serve as his representatives, and assist him in bringing to the Board of Directors any needed recommendations" (EN Bylaw 4.3) and also serve as non-voting members of the Board of Directors (EN Bylaw 9.1.2); and

WHEREAS, The English District may be better served by electing ordained ministers with various skill sets (legal, finance, investment, administration, etc.) to its Board of Directors without limitation by District Region; and

WHEREAS, The election of commissioned ministers as voting members of the Board of Directors is no longer limited by District Region (cf. 2018 Resolution 3-03A); and

WHEREAS, The proposed bylaw amendments would not change the existing practice of the District Convention electing six (6) ministers of religion and six (6) laypersons to serve as voting members of the Board of Directors; and

WHEREAS, The nomination process for election of ordained ministers to the Board of Directors at the 2025 English District Convention has been conducted under the current limitation by District Region (EN Bylaw 5.4.1); therefore be it

*Resolved,* That English District Bylaw 5.4 be amended as follows: PRESENT/PROPOSED WORDING

5.4.4 The District Convention shall elect one (1) ordained minister from the Eastern or Lake Eric Region, one (1) ordained minister from the Midwestern or Western Region, two (2) ordained ministers from the clergy roster of the District and two (2) commissioned ministers from the commissioned minister roster of the District: and one (1) layperson from each of the four regions of the District:

(a) A majority of votes cast shall be required for election.
(b) Palloting will proceed with the candidate receiving t

 (b) Balloting will proceed with the candidate receiving the least number of votes eliminated from consideration until one candidate receives a majority of the votes cast, who shall be declared elected.

 (c) No more than one ordained minister or commissioned minister shall be elected from the same congregation.

- 5.4.5 The District Convention shall elect one (1) layperson from each of the four regions of the District:
  - (a) A majority of votes cast shall be required for election.

- (b) <u>Balloting will proceed with the candidate receiving the least number of votes eliminated from consideration until one candidate receives a majority of the votes cast, who shall be declared elected.</u>

- 5.4.<u>56</u> The District Convention shall elect two (2) laypersons as at-large members of the Board of Directors:
- (a) All candidates not elected to a Lay Regional Board of Director positions shall form the ballot for the Lay At-Large Board of Directors positions. All candidates not elected to a Lay Regional Board of Director position, excluding any individual holding membership in the same congregation as an individual elected to a Lay Regional Board of Director position, shall form the ballot for the Lay At-Large Board of Directors positions.
- (b) A majority of votes cast shall be required for election.
- (c) When a second or succeeding ballot is required for a majority, the candidate receiving the fewest votes and all candidates receiving less than 15 percent of the votes cast shall be dropped from the ballot, unless fewer than two candidates receive 15 percent or more of the votes cast, in which case the three highest candidates shall constitute the ballot.

and be it further

Resolved, That English District Bylaw 9.1.1 be amended as follows:

## **PRESENT/PROPOSED WORDING**

- 9.1.1 The Board of Directors shall have no more than fifteen (15) voting members, as follows:
  - (a) The President of the District
  - (b) The Secretary of the District
  - (c) Two (2) ministers of religion—ordained<del>, one of whom shall be elected from either the Eastern Region or Lake Erie Region and one whom shall be elected from either the Midwestern Region or Western Region</del>
  - (d) Two (2) ministers of religion—commissioned
  - (e) One (1) layperson elected from each of the four regions of the District.
  - (f) Two (2) laypersons elected from the District at large
  - (g) Up to three (3) at-large laypersons appointed by the elected voting members of the Board of Directors to obtain needed additional skill sets (legal, finance, investment, administration, etc.)

#### **RESOLUTION 4-01A**

# To Request a Comprehensive Review of the Theological Concerns and Practical Procedures When a Call Is Terminated or Self-Terminated

#### Preamble

WHEREAS, The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) has committed to caring for pastors and church workers in one of its seven mission priorities, to wit: "To promote and nurture the spiritual, emotional, financial, and physical well-being of pastors and professional church workers;" and

WHEREAS, There are a number of reasons a person might self-terminate a Divine Call, e.g. age of retirement, mental or physical health concerns or incapacitations, personal conviction, etc.; and

WHEREAS, There is biblical precedent for the non-death ending of a tenure of service, e.g. Numbers 8:23-26; and

WHEREAS, The Commission on Theology and Church Relations (CTCR) discussed termination of Divine Call in its 2003 Report "Theology and Practice of 'The Divine Call" only from the perspective of outside termination and not self-termination; and

WHEREAS, Care should be given to the worker and the people of God served by the worker throughout the length of a Divine Call, including if a Call is terminated or self-terminated; and

WHEREAS, There is a paucity of theological rationale and practical direction in the Synod for the many ways a Divine Call might be self-terminated before death; and

WHEREAS, There can be confusion in the Church over legitimate and illegitimate reasons for terminating or self-terminating a Divine Call which might result in anxiety over Candidate status; therefore be it

*Resolved,* That church workers and congregations be given clear teaching on the theological and practical procedures when a Divine Call is terminated or self-terminated; and be it further

*Resolved,* That the English District memorialize Synod to instruct the CTCR to offer clarity regarding theological and practical considerations for the ways a Divine Call might be legitimately or illegitimately terminated or self-terminated; and be it further

Resolved, That the English District in convention memorialize Synod that the COP is to establish support and training materials for church workers who self-terminate their Divine Call legitimately; and be it further

*Resolved*, That district presidents and circuit visitors work with the workers and congregations of their district to support their called church workers before, during, and aftertimes of termination and self termination; and be it finally

*Resolved*, That the English District convention send this resolution as an overture to the 2026 Synod convention.

#### **RESOLUTION 4-02A**

# To Direct the Office of National Mission to Perform a Systematic Review of All Registered Service Organizations (RSOs)

WHEREAS, The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) has historically emphasized accountability and doctrinal integrity in its affiliations, ensuring that those organizations receiving its endorsement or partnership remain faithful to the teachings of Holy Scripture and the Lutheran Confessions (Titus 1:9, "He must hold firm to the trustworthy word as taught, so that he may be able to give instruction in sound doctrine and also to rebuke those who contradict it"); and

WHEREAS, The LCMS recognizes certain organizations as Registered Service Organizations (RSOs), granting them recognition and endorsement, and in some cases financial and institutional support, on the basis that their mission and practices align with biblical and confessional Lutheran teaching, as outlined in LCMS Bylaw 6.2, which establishes the process and requirements for RSO status within the Synod; and

WHEREAS, LCMS Bylaw 6.2.1 states that RSOs must "function in harmony with the programs of the boards of the Synod and in furtherance of the mission and ministry of the church", making it necessary to ensure ongoing compliance with doctrinal standards; and

WHEREAS, LCMS Bylaw 6.2.6 places oversight of RSOs under the Office of National Mission (ONM), which evaluates and reviews RSOs to determine whether they remain in alignment with LCMS doctrine and practice; and

WHEREAS, Faithful stewardship requires ongoing review to ensure that these organizations continue to uphold sound doctrine and biblical practices; and

WHEREAS, There is a growing need for transparency and accountability in the work of all organizations affiliated with the church, ensuring that they adhere to biblical principles in matters of faith, morality, and financial stewardship (Luke 16:10, "One who is faithful in a very little is also faithful in much"); and

WHEREAS, The LCMS must take seriously its responsibility to avoid supporting or endorsing organizations that have drifted from the teachings of Holy Scripture and the Lutheran Confessions (Romans 16:17, "I appeal to you, brothers, to watch out for those who cause divisions and create obstacles contrary to the doctrine that you have been taught; avoid them"); therefore, be it

Resolved, That the LCMS Office of National Mission, in coordination with the various mission offices and the council of presidents, conduct a systematic review of all RSOs, ensuring that each organization maintains alignment with biblical teaching and the doctrinal position of the LCMS; and be it further

*Resolved*, That this review assess each RSO's doctrinal stance, financial stewardship, and ethical practices in light of Scripture and the Lutheran Confessions; and be it further

Resolved, That the ONM, in coordination with the various mission offices and the council of presidents and in accordance with LCMS Bylaw 6.2.6, take corrective action regarding any RSO found to be doctrinally or ethically out of alignment with LCMS teachings, including but not limited to placing the

organization on probationary status, requiring doctrinal correction, or, if necessary, revoking RSO status; and be it further

Resolved, That the LCMS ONM, in coordination with the various mission offices and the council of presidents, shall take immediate action to revoke the RSO status of any organization that is publicly known to be acting in direct opposition to the doctrine of the Synod, including but not limited to those engaged in unlawful activity, those who abet lawbreakers, those who affirm or promote same-sex relationships, or those who facilitate the adoption of children to same-sex couples; and be it further

Resolved, That any RSO whose status has been revoked due to doctrinal or ethical violations may apply for reinstatement, provided that the organization demonstrates repentance, publicly renounces its previous errors, and affirms in writing its adherence to the biblical and confessional teachings of the LCMS; and be it further

Resolved, That organizations found to be out of alignment with LCMS doctrine be given a clear path to correction and reinstatement, provided they demonstrate repentance and a return to biblical and confessional teaching (Galatians 6:1, "Brothers, if anyone is caught in any transgression, you who are spiritual should restore him in a spirit of gentleness"); and be it further

*Resolved*, That the findings of this review be reported in their entirety to the Synod and made available for the benefit of congregations and members of the LCMS; and be it finally

*Resolved*, That the LCMS reaffirm its commitment to biblical stewardship, ensuring that all partnerships and affiliations reflect the mission and values of Christ's Church as taught in Holy Scripture and confessed in the Lutheran Confessions.

### **RESOLUTION 4-03A**

# To Affirm the Board of Regents and Administration of Concordia University Wisconsin and Ann Arbor in Their Efforts to Resolve Financial Deficits

WHEREAS, In February 2024 the Board of Regents of Concordia University Wisconsin and Ann Arbor (CUWAA), President Erik Ankerberg, and the administration of both campuses were confronted with financial realities that included a growing financial deficit; and

WHEREAS, The Ann Arbor campus had been unable to generate auxiliary revenue sufficient to meet its needs leading to an annual average operational shortfall of \$4 million for the entire university; and

WHEREAS, We recognize that CUWAA is a Lutheran higher education community of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod serving a focused educational mission in the world accountable for responsible stewardship; and

WHEREAS, Christians may disagree over how to handle challenging situations which may be concerning and painful for many to hear, especially students, faculty, staff, alumni, donors, and other CUAA and CUW stakeholders and the Ann Arbor community; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Regents, President Ankerberg, and the administration of CUWAA have demonstrated resolve and intentional strategic thought as they considered a variety of initiatives designed to better position CUWAA for the future; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Regents, President Ankerberg, and the administration of CUWAA have demonstrated faithful Christian leadership in their service to the students, faculty, staff, and Synod in a fair, reasonable, and responsible manner recognizing that as sinful, fallible mortals their communication efforts could have been handled better; therefore be it

*Resolved*, That the Board of Regents, President Ankerberg, and the administration of CUWAA be commended for making the necessary decisions to ensure that CUWAA is financially secure and sustainable for future generations; and be it further

Resolved, That by our prayers they would be encouraged in their responsibility to be "steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain" (1 Corinthians 15:58 ESV); and be it further

Resolved, That the English District continue to pray in good faith for the ongoing efforts of the Board of Regents, President Ankerberg, and the administration of CUWAA; and be it further

Resolved, That the English District continue to pray for the students, faculty, staff, alumni, donors, and other stakeholders of Concordia Ann Arbor as these initiatives have and continue to have impact on the Ann Arbor campus; and be it finally

Resolved, That since CUWAA directly impacts our churches, schools, and ministries and in the spirit of fraternal support and encouragement; the English District receive a report at its next Convention regarding the outcomes, benefits, and the ongoing efforts of the Board of Regents, President Ankerberg, and the entire administration of CUWAA.

**Rev. Dr. Chad Kendall** serves as the Associate Vice President for Church Relations and Mission and Associate Professor of Theology at Concordia University Chicago.
