# **Dominican Republic Lutheran Mission** celebrates 20 years of mission work!



Joint celebration service held on Sunday, Sept 7th in Palmar Arriba

15 FORO partners, including the South Wisconsin District and English District, gathered September 5-7 in Santiago, Dominican Republic, to celebrate with missionaries and Dominican Lutherans the 20<sup>th</sup> year since missionaries arrived in the country. Today, there are five missions, a Lutheran elementary school, a foundation for people with disabilities, as well as the regional seminary - Concordia Seminary, the Reformer, and the Mercy Center (CMSCR), which prepares pastors and deaconesses to serve in 14 countries across Latin America. Additionally, there are 3 preaching stations in proximity to the missions where there are not yet confirmed members.

On Saturday, missionaries and Dominicans alike presented

historical sketches of how the work began in each of their missions, school, foundation and where the work is presently. In each, we heard stories of thanksgiving, grace, and the mercies of our Lord Jesus as He has been faithful in allowing the Gospel to prosper through the preaching and administration of the sacraments.

On Sunday, over 200 Dominican Lutherans gathered from all over the country and a dozen pastors participated as Pastor Weber preached on the faithfulness of Christ and exhorted us to remember that Christ has remembered us and will continue to do so Sunday after Sunday through His means of grace.
