4th Annual Theological Conference lcms.org/krey



January started off with a bang as we welcomed a host of guests in the Dominican, for the annual Formación Pastoral Hispano (FPH) conference, which began on Epiphany Day, January 6th. This program is meant for older men who are working, supporting their families, and they study by taking 1 course at a time, 4 courses a year, for 4 years. Currently, 16 men are in this program, and 6 were able to attend the intensives this year.

Additionally, 10 prospective students considering pastoral service were present from the Dominican Republic, Mexico, Colombia, and Peru. Each of these men had the opportunity to visit with the faculty, meet students, be in worship, and participate in the hearing and discussion of good theology.

The focus for the intensives this year was on pastoral acts and ministry. The days began with Matins, and then seminars were held on Baptism, Confession and Absolution, the Lord's Supper, working with people with disabilities, youth, amongst others.

After each session, the men had the opportunity to break into groups and participate in the theological conversation, reflecting on how this might be worked out in ministry in their respective congregations.

With the visiting students, their mentors, prospective students, residential students, and seminary staff, the count reached close to 60, and made for great singing in the chapel, where we were also privileged to hear good preaching throughout the whole week!

We give thanks to our Lord for a total of 15 young men who are discerning whether the Lord is calling them to consider the Holy Ministry as pastors. We are thankful that the Holy Spirit is working on the hearts and minds of His people and working to send us men, for the fields are indeed ripe. We are thankful that if even half of the men come this September, we may have men studying from 10 different countries in residence. Pray that the Lord would grant these men discernment at this time.
